# Foreign Language Achievement Testing Service (FLATS)

Central Maine Community College (CMCC) offers matriculated students the opportunity to earn academic credit for language testing through Brigham Young University's (BYU) Foreign Language Achievement Testing Service (FLATS). Credits awarded are based on exam scores. CMCC awards six humanities credits (HUM 1XX) for a score of 12. Three credits are awarded for scores between 8 and 11. No credit is awarded for scores below 8. The results of the language exams are valid for a period of five years from the date of the exam. #### AFTER YOU REGISTER FOR AN EXAM

- 1. Go to the CMCC Business Office and pay the Proctoring Fee of \$25. You may also purchase a proctor voucher online at: <a href="http://www.cmcc.edu/testvoucher">http://www.cmcc.edu/testvoucher</a>. If you choose to purchase your proctor voucher online, be sure to *select FLATS Language Exam \$25 Proctor Fee*.
- 2. Email Dan Dundore (ddundore@cmcc.edu) at the CMCC Center for Testing & Assessment to schedule an appointment at least 10 days before you plan to test.
- 3. Bring a picture ID (e.g. student ID, driver's license) to the Testing Center on the day of your exam.
- 4. After you take an exam, Brigham Young University will email and mail your results to you and to CMCC's Registrar within 3 weeks. Credits awarded for passing scores will be transcripted to your student record as Humanities credit.

#### **Exam Format**

The tests are multiple-choice. All tests are graded on a pass/fail basis. Students are allowed two and a half hours to complete their test.

#### **Test Preparation**

There are no preparation materials available from BYU for the FLATS exams. One of the most successful ways to prepare for any given language test is to review your reading ability in the language. It is also helpful if you have a friend with whom you can practice both listening and speaking the language.

### **Frequently Asked Questions**

1. Q: How much credit can I earn for taking one of these exams?

A: Matriculated CMCC students can earn 3 or 6 credits, depending on the results of the exam. Credits awarded are based on exam scores. CMCC awards six humanities credits (HUM 1XX) for a score of 12. Three credits are awarded for scores between 8 and 11. No credit is awarded for scores below 8.

2. Q: When and where are the exams held?

A: You will arrange this directly with CMCC's Center for Testing & Assessment located in Jalbert Hall, near the library. You must contact the Center's administrator and arrange a time before showing up to take your exam.

- 3. Q: I can read and understand [language] well but have not practiced writing or speaking for a very long time. Would this put me at a disadvantage on the exam?
  - A: The exams are multiple-choice and, therefore, not designed to test writing or speaking skills. Each test has items that test listening, reading and grammar comprehension questions.
- 4. Q: I have not been able to find any sample questions. Are practice questions/exams available anywhere online? Could I be sent a practice exam/past exam to my home so I could see the kinds of questions that would be asked on the exam?

A: We do not provide practice exams or test preparation materials. The most successful way to prepare for any given test is to increase your reading of the language. It is also helpful if you have a friend to practice both listening and speaking of the language.

5. Q: When and how do I receive my exam results?

A: The student will receive official results within 3 weeks of completing the test. Official results will be mailed to CMCC only if the student indicated CMCC on the registration form. A copy will also be sent to the student's address indicated on the form, and a copy will be placed on file at BYU. If the student checks the "hold" box on the registration form, the scores will not be sent to CMCC.
